**O sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth! Psalm 96 verse 1**

How easy is it to think of singing a new song at this time? As I write we have had an extremely soggy weekend and the weather is still unsettled. The news of COVID19 seems to get worse all the time and the nights are drawing in. It feels as if we need a psalm of lament rather than this praise psalm which is set for this Sunday. But do we?

The psalmist goes on to remind us that God is great, that he made the heavens, and all creation praises him. God is at the centre holding the world 'The world is firmly established; it shall never be moved'.(10) Such words of confidence, which remind us that the Creator God is the one who holds us. That gives us hope, something to hold on to even in the darkest times.

This is not meant to be a trite response; life is difficult for many just now. There are times when we need to lament with the psalmist or shout at God with Job. Even as we do, the same God who is holding the world is holding us, and will continue to hold us until the storms pass and we can see again.

Or as Psalm23 puts it, 'Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me. (ps23:4) Let us remind each other of that light in the darkness as we travel together.

JOSH: Well, Jesus went into the desert for 40 days and 40 nights to spend time talking to God but he was tempted by the Devil.

TIM: Yes! We want to spend time with God but some things get in the way? What things prevent us from spending time with God?

George: Homework

George: Sport

Hannah: Watching TV

Anna: Meeting up with friends

Josh: Playing a game on my phone

TIM: None of these things are bad things, in fact, some of them are really good, worthwhile things. They're things we need to do or like to do to relax. However, sometimes they prevent us from spending time with God.

Jo: Firstly we need to desire to seek out God. Are we hungry or thirsty enough to want to spend time with Him? What stands out to you about hunger and thirst?

George: We all get hungry and thirsty!

Jo: Exactly! We can't go very long without food and drink. I've noticed that I get grumpy and tired if I don't have regular meals and I begin not feeling very well at all if I don't drink enough. What does that tell you?

Sarah: That food and water is necessary.

Josh: Yes, and that getting to know God is necessary too.

Rebekah: Exactly! Sometimes people make a decision to pray more, or read the Bible

everyday. This can be a hard decision to make but even harder to follow through on.

Tim: However, it's worth it!

God wants to be in a relationship with us. He already knows all about us but he wants us to know all about him. He wants to be the one we chat to about our day, good or bad! He wants to hear about the latest crazy idea we've had, the funniest thing that happened to you today. He wants to be the one we talk to you when we're feeling sad and upset and He also wants to be the one we talk to when we've got great news.

Jo: Who would you tell if your football team won a match you weren't expecting to win?

Josh: I don't play football.

George: My friends!

Jo: Who would you talk to if you had an argument with a friend at school?

Sermon

Hello Church,

If you've not met me before, my name's Tim and I have the privilege of, not just being one of the leaders of Konect4, but also one of the youth leaders who gets to work with our amazing young people at Kenilworth Methodist Church. And they've all been involved with this morning's service whether they've in front or behind of the camera or behind the scenes – they've all put something into this morning's service; so we hope you've enjoyed it.

This morning, I want to talk to you about something that has really been on my heart over the last couple of weeks, which is that – in this world where everything seems very chaotic at the moment – there is one thing that is sure and steadfast, which is that God loves us. And wants to spend time with us. And while that might seem like something that we know, it is something that we feel and something that we're desperate for.

In the first reading this morning in Exodus, it talked about how Moses was desperate to see God and God was so overcome by this that he said that he would move past Moses because he couldn't see his face and live. And God was moved by the hunger and the desperation in Moses to an extent that he did something about it and God hasn't changed. God is moved by how much we are desperate to be with him.

I've come to realise over the last couple of weeks, that one of the things that we hunger and thirst for at the moment is knowing what's going on. And the thing is that because we can't achieve that very easily at the minute, it's very easy for it to overcome other things that we should be longing or hungering and thirsting after. And it's important to realise that actually we are human beings that are easily distracted and human beings that it takes a while for things to sink into. And actually this is something that is important that we realise, because it happens really easily.

In the second reading in Revelation, God's dismay at the fact that people have forgotten their first love is so obvious. And that really hit a chord with me because I find that it comes back to me – that every time I let life get in the way and I forget how important God is to me and how I love to sit in his presence, and how I love to spend time with him, and how I love to worship him, that verse ends up coming back to me. It's a verse that I really have tried to build

large chunks of my life around because I don't want to ever forget what God's done for me. I don't want to ever forget how much I love him and how amazing it feels to be close to him. And sometimes I think we are guilty of that.

Sometimes I think we get caught up in a world and a church that's in an ever existing state of evolution. The world is not the same as it was two weeks ago, it seems at the minute, it changes hour on hour, day on day. And I think that sometimes we can get really caught up in that.

So this morning, I want to encourage you just to sit and reflect and remember the last time you just sat and spent time with God. Because, actually, sometimes it's really easy for that to all of a sudden realise it's been a while. And the sad thing is that the world is not getting any easier or any less busy. Despite the fact that we've all been locked in houses for the last nine months, it still feels as busy as ever – I don't know about you, but that's the way it feels for me. And I think that we lose sight of things. And then we come to the point where we work in a church where we live and we work and we're part of a church that has – that is evolving and changing and asking questions – which are good questions to ask – but I think sometimes we make the questions the issue. And while I'm proud to be part of a church that asks questions about the way we view things, I don't want that to come in place of the core values of the church – and the core value of the church for me is that we love God and God loves us, and we want a relationship with him.

The Bible says, seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all other things will be added unto you. And I think that sometimes, we get so stuck on the problem and on working out how to fix it, that we forget, that actually, all our wisdom and all our knowledge comes from God. And despite the fact that we work hard to obtain



it, it's all a gift and it comes from the love that God has for us.

I deliberately picked the reading from 1 John, because it talks about how we love each other only because God loved us first. And everything comes from that first love. That first encounter we have with God sets up our relationship with him and sometimes we forget about it—sometimes we forget how amazing it is to meet God for the first time. And especially at the minute when we're not in a church that's getting new people come into it, we don't see that as often which can make this an even bigger challenge. But, God is still doing amazing things and I think that us not being in a building, it doesn't mean we can't love God any more or any less. And he definitely doesn't love us any more or any less. It's impossible for him to love us more than he does.

I want to be part of a church that, yeah, tackles and looks at problems, but I also want to be part of a church that is overcome with love for God and because of that is overcome with love and compassion for other people. But also that focusses on that, and knows that that's the reason behind everything that they do. And while I work and serve with a bunch of amazing people, it's really easy for us to lose the fact that that's the reason.

So my prayer this morning is that we'd all remember how amazing it was to meet God for the first time; we'd all learn to focus on that.

I hope that in the short time I've had to share with you this morning, you've caught me heart. I know there's been a lot of me in there and I've been suffering with feeling a bit rubbish this week so this might have meandered a little but through the middle of it I'm hoping you've caught the heart of what I'm trying to say - which is that Jesus loves us so much and just wants to spend time with us. Actually the more time we spend just being with him, not sitting there and

giving him lists of requests or thinking about in passing but actually just sitting there and dwelling in his presence, the easier the problems that we face in everyday life will become to manage in our heads.

I find it really easy to lose focus on hungering after spending time with God. That's primarily because I get bored easily, cause that's just who I am but I always look for the next thing, but actually, every time I step away from that being my focus, the verse from Revelation hits me in the head. And I hope that this has challenged you to remember your first love and to gain strength from the love that God has for us so that you can better love others.

In reflecting on what we've just heard, we're going to sing together a song that talks about loving and being in a relationship with Jesus being what we really long for and how it's a core part of who we are. So we're going to sing together 'Hungry I come to you, for I know you satisfy.
