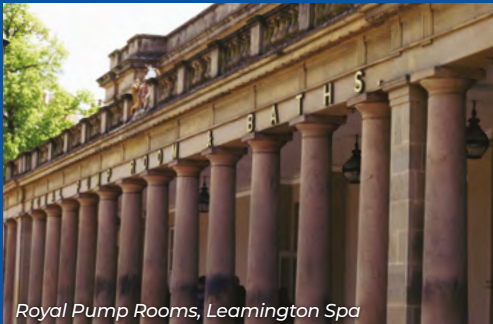
Warwick District Council is proud to be part of England's largest celebration of history and culture.

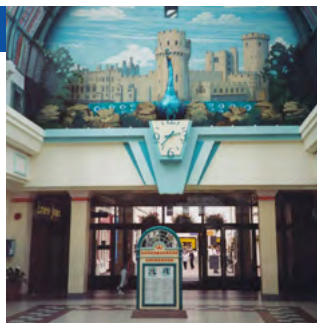

POLISH CENTRE

54 High Street, CV31 1LW

Leamington Spa's first Town Hall and Police Station, designed by Russell and opened in 1830, has been the Polish Centre since 1968. Visitors will be able to see the original Council Chamber, Queen Victoria's balcony and the upper part of the ballroom, now used as a Roman Catholic Chapel.

Visitors are not required to book in advance; please note that there is no disabled access to the building.

ST MARK'S CHURCH

Rugby Road, CV32 6DL

Step inside St Mark's Church, Leamington Spa, and explore one of the town's finest Victorian buildings. Discover its beautiful architecture designed by George Gilbert-Scott Jnr.(1879), and William Kemp stained glass on a relaxed, self-guided tour. Enjoy tea, coffee and home-made cake. There are fun children's activities available throughout the day.

Established in 1894, the allotment site has a diversity of shed designs including riverside chalets on the banks of the River Leam. A haven of wildlife with Victorian water baths from the former Warneford Hospital.

ST MARY'S CHURCH

St Mary's Road, CV31 1JW

St Mary's church is one of the oldest churches in Leamington. It was designed in 1838 by J.G Jackson and built in 1839, with an almost entirely stucco finish, including the tower. It was known as 'The Church in the Field', as it stood alone in some fields in anticipation of the new Victorian housing which would soon follow as Leamington began to grow as a new Spa town.

ST PETER'S RC CHURCH

Dormer Place, CV32 5AA

A rare example of a Church with its associated Presbytery designed in the 13th century Lombardic style by one of the leading Victorian ecclesiastical architects, Henry Clutton (1819-1893); built between 1862 and 1864. There are some very fine stained-glass windows by Hardman and Dury as well as monuments from the former George Street Chapel, including one to a Waterloo veteran by Augustus Pugin. **Guides and refreshments will be available.**

Step inside this regency architectural gem. Meet local freemasons, discover the temple and uncover some of the secrets of this historic building.

A magnificent Georgian building, completed in 1697 but with parts of the former Tudor building still there. Now a Masonic meeting place and popular weddings and events venue. This is a great opportunity to visit a masonic lodge room and find out more about the movement.

THE COLLEGIATE CHURCH OF ST MARY

Old Square, CV34 4RA

Set in the heart of Warwick, St Mary's dates back over 900 years and is one of the largest parish churches in England. Some hidden gems include, the Dean's Chapel, Beauchamp Chapel, crypt, our Victorian ringing room and ring of 10 magnificent bells.

The church is open daily. Monday to Saturday (excl. Wed) 10:30am to 5pm. Wednesday 11am to 5pm. Sunday 12pm to 5pm. Tours of the tower with an opportunity to see the Victorian ringing room and bells will be available on certain days. Tours are limited to 12 people. No booking required.

COURT HOUSE

Jury Street, CV34 4EW

Take a tour of the Court House, designed and built by Francis Smith in 1725. The Court House replaced a medieval tavern, one of the few buildings which survived the Great Fire of Warwick in 1694.

THE FUSILIER MUSEUM

Pageant House, Jury Street, CV34 4EW

Exhibition: 'Faces of the Somme' explores one of the most important battles of WW1 through the eyes of the soldiers of the Royal Warwickshire Regiment. Linked to this exhibition, there are family activities and opportunities to dress up in the uniform and kit of a soldier of the Somme.

GUY'S CLIFFE CENTRE

Coventry Road, CV34 5YD

Set in eight acres of parkland this ancient location is where the legendary Guy of Warwick lived and died as a hermit. The site was also a saxon hermitage dating from the mid 6th century and is of Triassic geological special scientific interest. Come and view Guys Cliffe ruin, view the remains of Guy's Cliffe House and visit St Mary Magdalen Chapel which is currently used as a masonic temple.

GUY'S CLIFFE WALLED GARDEN

Coventry Road, CV34 5FJ. Behind Hintons Nursery

Come and explore the fascinating history of Guy's Cliffe walled gardens, dating from the 1770s and supplying the Guy's Cliffe estate until the 1940s. 250 years later – the garden is now supplying its fresh fruit and vegetables to the local foodbanks and night shelter; however, some of the produce will also be available to buy over the heritage weekend. There will also be activities for younger visitors.

Visit Edward Welby Pugin's Decorated English Gothic church, with its beautiful interior refurbished in 2025. Stained glass by Hardman and by French artist Tony Dury, who was a parishioner and sang in the choir at the opening Mass in 1860. JRR Tolkien was married here in 1916.

ST NICHOLAS CHURCH

St Nicholas Church Street, CV34 4JD

Take a guided tour of this unusually fine example of gothic revival architecture, built by Thomas Johnson of Warwick. The church pre-dates the Victorian excesses and has a rare, delicate, simple style. Refreshments available during opening hours.

In addition to the museum's collections is the opportunity to see the Warwick Castle Unboxed exhibition and discover more about the people who lived and worked at the castle. **Free talk An Unconventional Woman: Daisy Greville 'The Red Countess' of Warwick on Thursday 17 at 1pm.** Eccentric Daisy, known for inspiring songs about bicycles made for two and her pet fox, ran for parliament five years after women over 30 won the vote. Find out how this aristocratic and famous socialite came to receive the Labour Party nomination in 1923.

ST MICHAEL'S PLACE

Birmingham Road, Saltisford, CV34 4TT

Join members of the St Michael's Place project team and learn about the Master's House and St Michael's Chapel in Saltisford past, present and future. The project has just been awarded a £2.8Million grant from The National Lottery Heritage Fund. There will be no access inside the historic buildings due to their current condition, but it will be possible to view them externally and to learn what we currently know about the site and former usage, future plans to rescue and provide a sustainable future for the historically significant site.

Visitors can view historical pictures and literature illustrating the church's development through time. Guides will be on hand to provide information and visitors are welcomed to enjoy the calm and relaxing atmosphere.

WARWICK SOCIETY TOWN WALKS

Starting from Shire Hall, Market Place, CV34 4RL

The mediaeval town of Warwick was badly damaged in the Great Fire of 1694. It was rebuilt in very early Georgian architecture. Much has changed since 1945, but the essence of the townscape remains. Now, it faces challenges of redevelopment sites and too much vehicle traffic. Explore and learn more about its history, its buildings and its prospects.

Meet at the main steps of the Shire Hall in the Market Place. The walk will be over a mile long, and take about 75 mins. We will follow pavements, road crossings and avoid steps. Wheelchair users are welcome to join.

WARWICKSHIRE YEOMANRY MUSEUM

Castle Street, CV34 4EW (situated in the basement of the Court House)

This Museum is managed through a charitable trust which is entirely reliant on volunteers, there are no paid staff. Its aim is to safeguard the heritage and collective memory of those who served with the Warwickshire Yeomanry during the period 1794 to 1956 when the regiment amalgamated with the Queen's Own Worcestershire Hussars.

Located close to the remains of Kenilworth Abbey, this lovely church features a 14th century west tower and spire, decorated arches and perpendicular clerestory restored in 1864.

ST BARNABAS CHURCH

Albion St, CV8 2FY

Previously known as St Nicholas Mission Room, services at St Barnabas began back in 1886 in the community of Albion Street, the church is part of the Parish Church of St Nicholas.

KENILWORTH ABBEY MUSEUM & HERITAGE CENTRE

Abbey Fields, CV8 1BP

Kenilworth Abbey Museum & Heritage Centre is housed in a 14th century red sandstone building, once part of the medieval Abbey. 2026 marks the 760th anniversary of the great siege of Kenilworth Castle. One of the original stone Trebuchet balls, which was fired into the castle during the siege and discovered during an excavation many years later, is now on display. Join a guided walk of the Abbey ruins and learn about the men who lived and worked in this once magnificent medieval Abbey. Hear why there are now just a few sad ruins of their once beautiful buildings.

BADDESLEY CLINTON

Rising Lane, Baddesley Clinton, B93 0DQ

The magic of Baddesley Clinton comes from its secluded, timeless setting deep within its own parkland. From refuge to haven, this atmospheric moated manor house has been a sanctuary since the 15th century. Discover Baddesley's late medieval, Tudor and 20th-century histories and uncover its stories, from hiding persecuted Catholics in its priest's holes, to the history of the Ferrers family who lived at Baddesley for more than 500 years.

PACKWOOD HOUSE

Packwood Lane, Lapworth, B94 6AT

Surrounded by beautiful gardens and countryside, Packwood was described by a guest in the 1930s as 'a house to dream of, a garden to dream in'. Lovingly restored at the beginning of the 20th century by Graham Baron Ash, you can discover the detail behind the man, his passion for collecting and his collection. The gardens include brightly coloured, 'mingled style' herbaceous borders, famous sculpted yews and an 18th-century gentleman's kitchen garden.

CHURCH OF ST MARY, HASELEY

Firs Lane, CV35 7LS

This stunning Grade I listed medieval church with box pews is located in an idyllic setting close to Warwick. Visitors can see the candles used for services, the perpendicular octagonal font and 1573 tomb chest memorial to Clement Throckmorton.

ST CHADS CHURCH, BISHOP'S TACHBROOK

CV33 9RJ

This beautiful building has its roots deep in history, parts of which go back to the 12th century. The aisle and tower were added in the late 14th and early 15th century. Two of the beautiful stained glass windows are of special interest. The first is in memory of Charles Kingsley the other is an early work of William Morris.

ST ANNE'S CATHOLIC CHURCH, WAPPENBURY

Church Lane, CV33 9DW

St Anne's is a small, country parish church which sits on a large, fortified Iron Age settlement dating back to approximately 700BC known as the Wappenbury camp. The river Leam forming part of its defences. The church originally dates back to the 1700s. The church was completely renovated and refurbished in 2014.

ST JOHN THE BAPTIST CHURCH, WASPERTON

CV35 8EB

Small church remodelled 1847 by GG Scott includes a 16th Century pulpit an 18th Century wrought iron communion rail, a timber porch, bellcote with spirelet and two Pugin designed windows.

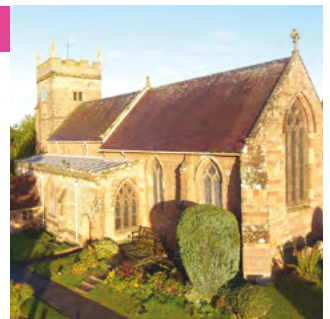
ST MARY'S CHURCH, CUBBINGTON

Church Lane, CV32 7JT

A chance to visit this Grade I listed Norman church dating from the 12th century with exceptional stained glass windows and surrounded by an award winning churchyard. Bells were hung in the church tower in the early 1600s and have been rung regularly ever since.

ST MARGARETS CHURCH, HUNNINGHAM

School Lane, CV33 9DS

Located in a delightful rural setting the church was built in 1216 so that residents could attend services when the river crossing to Wappenbury was flooded. The church was constructed with Ashlar sandstone with Victorian additions and a wooden bell tower. Over the last two years the bell tower has been fully restored including its iconic 8 degree lean thanks to the Friends of Hunningham Church. The West wall consists of a huge exterior buttress and a long pointed light containing the Millennium window. The font is white sandstone from the 14th century.

ST PETER'S CHURCH, BARFORD

Church Street, CV35 8BS

There has been a church on the site since Saxon times. The present church was re-built in the 1840s save for the Tower which is 14th century. It houses a ring of 6 bells and careful examination of its exterior shows bullet holes left during the Civil War. In the churchyard lies buried Joseph Arch (1826-1919) who was born in a nearby cottage. He founded the National Union of Agricultural Labourers. His tomb is marked with an obelisk.

TEMPLE BALSALL CHURCH & The Foundation of Lady Katherine Leveson

Fen End Road West, Temple Balsall, B93 0AN

A tranquil rural setting dating back to 1146, with 17th century endowments for church, almshouses and a school by sisters Lady Katherine Leveson & Lady Anne Holbourne. The church was restored in 19th century by Sir George Gilbert Scott, and the composer of 'It's a Long Way to Tipperary' is buried in the nearby cemetery. Visit the historical site with art exhibition. Saturday guided tours, autumn fayre, Morris dancing and activities for children. Sunday guided tour at 1.45pm.

CHESTERTON WINDMILL

CV33 9LB

An opportunity to see inside this unique historic windmill. One of Warwickshire's most recognisable landmarks the windmill is one of the oldest in the country to still have working machinery. Time spent inside the windmill is about 20 minutes but expect to queue for entry.

You will be able to find out more about the history of the mill and visit the refreshments tent as part of your visit.

St Michael's church a grade II listed building built in the 1870s on the site of a much older chapel. It was designed by Ewan Christian, an eminent Victorian architect who also designed the National Portrait Gallery. The church contains many memorials that pre-date the current church. The east window depicts St Michael, and was produced by William Wailes of Newcastle-on-Tyne.

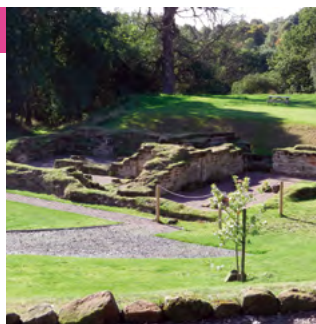
BAGOT'S CASTLE

The remains have been consolidated and the whole site opened up to expose other historic features. An Education Visitor Centre has been built and a picnic area added for the many visitors who have visited the castle since it was opened to the public in 2009. **Bagot's Castle is located at the end of Church Road, Baginton, CV8 3AR just past the church on the right as you go down Church Road. Car park at the end of Church Road – overflow car parking at the Blacksmith Shop just as you enter Church Road/Signs will be in place.**
