Our Letter from Rev Sally

Dear friends, My warmest greetings to you all.

You will see from Anne's letter that something which is very much on our minds as a Leadership Team at the moment is the proposed merger with Whitnash Methodist Church. Anne's letter sets out the background to this, but I do encourage you to have conversations with myself or one of the Leadership team if there is something you are not sure of. The aim is to try and ease some of the administrative burden for the Whitnash stewards in order to free them up to carry out the missional work that will lead to growth. I must reassure people that Whitnash is financially self-sufficient and there is no understanding that Warwick will support Whitnash financially. However, something we could do is to support them administratively. This model has already been implemented at Stratford-Henley and is in the process of being put into action at Dale Street with Cubbington, albeit in a slightly different way.

Please will you pray and think about this, so that when we come to Church Council on May 1st we are able to discuss the matter with care and insight. But be ready for when God answers that prayer! I say this because I would like to recount something that happened at the last Whitnash Messy Church event.

Numbers have been rather quiet at Messy Church for a few months now, with around 8 children attending, and for some time the Messy Church team have been praying for increased interest from the local community. (In fact, most times I drive into Whitnash, I am praying 'What is it that you want us to do here, God?'). Then, on the Wednesday before the last Messy Church, (they take place on a Saturday), Graeme and I had visited the local primary school and taken the assemblies, and given out some flyers that Thrive had had printed for us. To cut a wonderful story short, we had the most children and parents that we have ever had! We went way past our usual cut-off of 20 children. The booked-in children exceeded that number and people were turning up on the morning asking to come. There was a flurry of early morning activity as we all checked that we had enough resources for our activities and enough food for lunch – as 42 people received lunch that day! I have been pondering on all this since it happened, and asking myself several questions, including: Do we pray expecting God to answer? So when God answers, should we be surprised? And when God answers, are we ready? We weren't really ready at Whitnash for God to answer in quite that way! But the Bible says 'Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you'. 'You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart'. 'If you believe, you will receive whatever you ask for in prayer'. 'Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God'.

Matthew, Jeremiah, Paul and many other biblical writers understood that the sincere prayer offered in love and faith will be answered. Of course, the answer may not always be the one we are wanting or expecting, but we place our prayers into the great wisdom and love of God.

Philip Yancey writes:

'I pray in astonished belief that God desires an ongoing relationship. I pray in trust that the act of prayer is God's designated way of closing the vast gulf between infinity and me. I pray in order to put myself in the stream of God's healing work on earth. I pray as I breathe - because I can't help it. Prayer is hardly a perfect form of communication, for I, an imperfect, material being who lives on an imperfect, material planet am reaching out for a perfect, spiritual Being. Some prayers go unanswered, a sense of God's presence ebbs and flows, and often I sense more mystery than resolution. Nevertheless I keep at it, believing with Paul that, 'Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.'

So let's keep praying, friends, with expectation and readiness.

This prayer is by Gill Bailey, a perfect prayer post-Easter. It's titled simply 'Thank You':

Jesus, you were always special.

You turned this world's values upside down.

Not for you the 'look-after-number-one' message of our age,

but 'look after them', you said, and you did.

Not for you the 'hold on to what you have' advice we're given,

but 'give your all', you said, and you did.

Not me first, but you first;

'not my will, but your will', you said.

Not for you a gentle, easy birth.

Not for you a gentle, easy life.

Not for you a gentle, easy death.

Your life was never easy;

your death far from it.

But through your suffering we are free, free to live and love right here and now, free to live your way, free to give, to share, free to count all who inhabit this earth with us as friends and neighbours, free to be your people, and to remember that they are your people too. Because of what you have done, one day, round some distant corner, we and all who believe will spend eternity with you.

So thank you, Jesus, thank you for coming to us, thank you for dying for us, thank you for rising and living again. Thank you that in you there is always hope. Thank you, Jesus — just thank you!

May God bless you, those whom you love, and those you are called to love in God's name,

Proposed merger between Warwick and Whitnash Methodist Churches.

At the Church Council meeting on May 1st (1.30pm), we will be discussing and voting on a proposal to merge the two churches, and I want to give members some background to this discussion.

Whitnash has 6 active members and 14 members on paper, which means that its future is uncertain. Once a church has less than 12 members for four consecutive quarters, it has no choice but to merge with another church, or cease to meet. The active members at Whitnash are very keen to continue to provide a Methodist presence in the town and have plenty of ideas such as a Food Pantry, Community Garden, and developing links to Whitnash Primary School. Graeme Russell, our Church and Community Missioner, is involved with several projects there.

There are fortnightly services on a Sunday, and the Parade services every couple of months have about 40 attending. Whitnash MC has a regular organist. Messy Church is held once a month, with a regular 8-10 children. The last Messy Church followed Graeme Russell's and Rev Sally's Assemblies a few days before — see Sally's letter to find out what happened here! Coffee mornings are held usually monthly on a Saturday morning. Warm Hub is held weekly on Thursday from 11.30-1.30.

The church hall is well used, with five uniformed organisation groups on four evenings, Keep Fit on 4 mornings a week, and youth organisation THRIVE hiring the office and occasionally using the church. There is a potential for a before and after School Club from September. These lettings should cover costs.

A merger would result in a merging of committees, such as Finance and Property, and one Church Council for the new church. This would help to relieve the pressure on the minister who has to attend all these meetings at two churches, and free up the stewards at Whitnash to do more Mission and Outreach work.

BENEFITS:

To Whitnash – they can stay open and continue God's work in the town with renewed energy.

To Warwick – helping the wider mission of the church.

To the Minister – reducing the number of meetings that need to be attended, and streamlining the management of the two churches.

This model has been encouraged by the Circuit Superintendent, as a way to free up the time of both lay and ordained people in order to actively work towards church growth. This model has also been found to be successful in other Circuits. What is envisaged are 'multi-site' churches who share a trustee body, thus reducing the number of Managing Trustee bodies but maintaining where possible the number of worshipping communities.

This process can be completed by two or more churches merging together to form a new Local Church (either on one site or multi-sited).

Proposed merger continued......

Henley has already merged with Stratford, and Cubbington is in the process of merging with Dale Street. We are not pursuing a merger with Wellesbourne.

The leadership team hopes that members will support this proposal when it comes to a vote on May 1st. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to talk to one of the leadership team. In the meantime, your prayers for all those involved would be appreciated.

World Day of Prayer 2024

"I beg you, bear with one another in love"

On Friday 1st March, friends from the Warwick churches joined us at Northgate for the annual service to celebrate the World Day of Prayer. This year the service and supporting resources had been prepared by an ecumenical group of Christian women from Palestine. In the words of WDP, "the land in which Jesus was born, ministered and died, and where the Christian faith began and is rooted".

The service itself began with a presentation of images from Palestine and accompanying information about the history, geography, culture and the role of women, Christianity and interfaith issues in the region. The WDP countries are selected years in advance, and the materials prepared well before the year of the service, yet every year the chosen theme seems to become strikingly relevant as the year unfolds. For 2024 the theme was from Ephesians 4 v1 "I beg you, bear with one another in love". In light of the current situation in the region and distressing reports and images in the news, this text was particularly poignant.

During the service we had readings, hymns, prayers for peace and stories of Palestinian women witnessing to the power of bearing together in love, presented by Rev Sally and CTW members. Everyone had been given a bookmark featuring the words "Put peace into each other's hands and like a treasure hold it" from the Fred Kaan hymn. As the peace was being shared, these bookmarks were exchanged, and then the hymn was sung, creating a moving sequence. Rev Sally had invited Chris Foy from St Nicholas' Church to play the organ for us and we enthusiastically sang the well-known hymns and the newly composed songs.

After the service most people joined us for a lunch in the community centre where soups prepared by Susan and by Trevor were much enjoyed in the time of fellowship. The display of photographs and produce from Palestine which had been in church for the service was brought into the hall and the Palestinian cakes prepared by Edward from St Paul's, and the oranges were shared with the meal.

We are grateful to the local World Day of Prayer team for organising the materials, and to Rev Sally for her guidance and leading the service (and preparing all the bookmarks!). Many thanks also to Ken for managing the sound, Susan and Trevor for the super soups, to all who helped us with the setting up and clearing away and to everyone who came along on the day.
