At 12 noon, after a short reflection and prayer - a lunch of soup and scones are served, all freshly made!!!





From the Leadership Team:

We started the new year with a very special Covenant service on January 11th. Not only did we welcome new members Jan & Mark, but we launched our new pastoral support system and blessed those co-ordinating our pastoral care. Every member and adherent is now in a small group, tasked with supporting each other, and passing on any concerns to the pastoral secretary or minister, via their pastoral link. The old class system with pastoral visitors was no longer fit for purpose, as each pastoral visitor had too many in their group to be able to keep in touch properly. We hope that everyone will embrace this new system and support one another as Christ called us to do. It was lovely to see everyone sitting in their new groups during the Faith Lunch after the service.



We hope that you all enjoyed the Christmas services. Our friends from the learning-disabled community certainly enjoyed the Christingle service, and the puppets at the Carol service were well received. Around 100 small, knitted angels, with a card from church, were left around the town in the run up to Christmas and all were quickly taken. Thank you to everyone who contributed to all our Christmas activities.

The refurbished kitchen and toilets have received much praise, and I'm pleased to let you know that the lower ground floor facilities will be upgraded in February (the men are very pleased!). Remember that we are improving our facilities to attract outside users as well, so please spread the word around potential hirers.

We could do with some help on Community Tuesdays please, particularly at Bread Church on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday (and every week in Lent). We need a couple of extra people each week who will be there to chat to and help our guests, particularly those arriving for the first time. Please chat to Trevor Blades, Ian Meddoms or Anne Oliver to find out what is needed.

We will soon be in Lent, and I'm sure that Sally will be telling you all about the Lent groups which will meet each week, with the session on a Wednesday afternoon being repeated on a Thursday evening. We hope that everyone will find time to attend one each week; this is a great opportunity for fellowship and spiritual growth. Our social event for February will be on Saturday 21st, a screening of the film on which the Lent study is based.

Our Ministers Letter.....



*Dear Friends,
My warmest greetings to you all,*

Here are some wonderful words from 1 John 4:

⁷ Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. ⁸ Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. ⁹ This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. ¹⁰ This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. ¹¹ Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. ¹² No one has ever seen God; **but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.**

One of the ways in which we are called to live as the body of Christ – probably the most important way - is in the giving of our love, care and support to others. Wesley was the catalyst for many amazing things and he called for the early Methodists to “watch over one another in love,” to practically love and care for each other, and to encourage each other. One of the most important things we all need to remember is that pastoral care – watching over one another in love – should be at the very heart of who we are as Methodists. Pastoral care is everyone’s responsibility, but it is also everyone’s joy and delight.

In response to this, on January 11th, our Covenant Sunday, we launched our new system of pastoral care – a new arrangement that will help us to better watch over each other in love. Our wonderful Pastoral Visitors, under the careful guidance of Janice Witham, have done beautiful work of watching over us in love. But the previous system was showing signs of strain, and the Pastoral Team was concerned that they were not able to support everyone as they would like to do. So, as in many other churches, a new way of caring for each other has been designed. This has taken a good deal of work and effort by Janice, Anne and Julie, and I am very grateful to them for the commitment they have shown to getting this off the ground.



The foundation of this new way of doing things is our **Pastoral Groups** – small groups of people who know at least one or two people in that group. Groups are fairly small, around 4 to 6 in number. The groups are based on friendships, using suggestions people previously made about who they would like to be in a group with. The members of each Pastoral Group will keep in contact with each other, perhaps by phone, or face to face, or letter, or email, or WhatsApp, at church or by meeting up in the week. The group will be the main pastoral support for the people in it. We realised a lot of this happens naturally already and we wanted to celebrate that and build on it. We also wanted to ensure that people who can no longer get to church still feel supported by the people who can. With this in mind, each group also has some people in their group who are no longer able to attend.

Watching over the groups are the **Pastoral Link** people. Each group has a named Pastoral Link, who can be contacted if there is an issue or difficulty, in much the same way that a Pastoral Visitor could be contacted in the past. Each Pastoral Link is in a group themselves, too, so that they can be watched over in love as well. If the Pastoral Link hears of an issue that s/he thinks needs passing on, this can be communicated to Janice or myself, as before. Janice will continue to co-ordinate meetings of the Pastoral Links, and the Prayer Circle will still play a vital role. Prayer requests will still be made to them in the way they were previously.

A key part of ‘watching over each other in love’ is **prayer**. It would be wonderful if the Pastoral Groups could commit to praying for each other in a way that is comfortable for them – this could be done in any way the group chooses. Groups could simply say to each other ‘by the time we see each other again I will have prayed for you’. Groups could set a time and say, for instance, ‘on Tuesday at 4pm I am going to pray for you’. People could ring each other up and say the Lord’s Prayer down the phone with each other. I invite you to be bold and have a go!

After our Covenant Service we shared a Faith Lunch together, inviting the members of each group to sit with each other and use the time to chat and decide how best to keep in contact. It was a lovely way of seeing something that had previously only existed on paper come to life.

Anything new always takes a while to settle down – so if you have any questions, please do get in touch with Janice, Anne, Julie or myself and we will do our best to answer your query.

Who else do we need to watch over in love? Our love and care for others should not be insular, or restricted to those that look and sound like us, or those whom we feel ‘on a wavelength’ with. If we really believe that ‘all are welcome in this place’ (in the words of StF 409, ‘Let us build a house where love can dwell’) then our love and care must extend into much wider circles than our immediate church community. It was a beautiful God-moment for me when, a few minutes before the Covenant Service began, I happened to meet George and he gave me a copy of a poem that he had told me about a few weeks earlier. It is entitled ‘Refugee’, by Brian Bilston, and is reproduced in this Newsletter. First you read it top to bottom in the normal way, then you read it bottom to top, and see what a difference it makes...

May God bless you, those whom you love, and those you are called to love in God’s name.

And – let’s not forget to be joyful, be prayerful and be thankful!

One Church to Pentecost 2026

Born in Song – God's people have always been singing

Dear Friends,

This is the first bulletin of 2026 to update you on our plans for ONE CHURCH to PENTECOST 2026.

Its purpose is to clarify the dates and some of the details (more details will follow soon), to reassure you that this is an experiment and not a decision about our shared future, and to seek volunteers to ensure that we make this experience a good one.

All the twelve churches across the South Warwickshire Circuit will meet together at 10.30am each Sunday morning at the Bridge House Theatre in Warwick for five Sunday mornings, beginning on Sunday 26 April, culminating with Pentecost 2026 on Sunday 24 May.

There is plenty of parking at the theatre and transport arrangements from our current churches are being developed.

A Young Church option will be available for children and young people.

In preparation for our worship together, existing house groups and those who would like to join a One Church to Pentecost group in their locality will have the opportunity to get to know others and to study together. Groups will meet in churches and in homes during the five-week period running up to Pentecost.

We are aware that the initial announcement of this proposal caused anxiety. We want to stress that this is an experiment to explore a different way of working together. As a Circuit we are aware that we will not have the resources in the future to continue to support twelve churches. Over the long term we need to think creatively about our options.

The December Circuit Meeting carefully considered the concerns raised and decided that the need to address the future challenges justified the plan to go ahead with One Church to Pentecost in 2026.

This admittedly radical idea allows us a period to trial an option which may or may not work. If it is successful in 2026, the Circuit Meeting might decide to repeat it in 2027 before making any long-term decisions.

For those who want to know more about the background to this idea we are offering an information sharing evening on Wednesday 25 February at 7.30pm Warwick Methodist Church.

So how can you get involved or help? Could you offer to assist on one or two Sundays with making One Church happen?

Could you, for instance,

- ❑ Join a prayer group starting now to support the planning?
- ❑ Help with organization of getting people and resources to the Theatre?
- ❑ Contribute to worship – musically, reading, serving communion, etc.
- ❑ Steward or provide refreshments at one of the services?
- ❑ Help with Young Church?
- ❑ Host or Lead a House Group?
- ❑ Is there something else you would like to offer?
