The most exciting news is that Rev. Sally is staying with us for a further five years from September 2026. It was a privilege to read the submissions from a variety of members when I canvassed opinions as to whether Sally should be invited to stay; there was no doubt that all were in favour! We are truly blessed that Sally wanted to stay and that she has been invited to do so.

The second celebration is for the completion of our major project to refurbish the facilities in our Community Centre, so that we can raise funds through lettings, and offer it to charity groups to help them fulfil their purposes. The kitchen and adjacent toilets are looking superb, and the entrance has been greatly improved with the new internal doors. The porch, corridors and stairways are going to be redecorated at the end of October into November, and we think we have enough funds to refurbish the toilets on the lower level too. This work would not have been possible without the support of our members, through fundraising and donations, and the efforts of Trevor Blades who has project managed and applied for grants. Our Ministers Letter



Dear friends, My warmest greetings to you all.

At our recent Harvest Festival, we touched on the theme of abundance. The season of Harvest is the perfect time to be thinking about the abundance of God's love and care for us, and the abundance of God's provision for us in the world. Those of you who were there will remember that we discussed some of our favourite foods, there was a huge variety! We live in a country where most people (sadly not all) have access to an incredible variety of food, and this was apparent in the many different answers from the congregation. Most of them I thoroughly agreed with, although I am still just a little uncertain about a fried egg and cheese sandwich......

We also took time to ponder the abundance of God's love for us, as we rejoiced with Ken and Beatrice who were celebrating fifty years of marriage, their Golden Wedding! It was lovely to be able to welcome their family into church and have them join us for lunch. We focused on 1 John 4, which contains some wonderful truths. Verse 11 reads 'Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another'. Beautifully simple in intent, but not always easy to achieve. There are so many memorable verses in this passage, another of them being 'God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them'. What greater wonder could there be? The God of everything choosing to abide in us, as sinful and self-centred as we are? Abiding in us, and loving us, no matter what? Astonishing!

Autumn time is another opportunity to marvel at and celebrate the abundance of God's love for us, as demonstrated in the glory of the beauty that surrounds us. We recently celebrated this on the WhatsApp group by posting different autumn photos that we had taken. Even on a dull day, the colours of the trees or the abundance of shiny berries tells of the glory of God. When John Keats wrote of 'Seasons of mists and mellow fruitfulness' he describes scenes of sensory overload, a glorious, literal fruition of labour and creativity.



So, when Jesus says 'I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly' (John 10:10), by looking at the party of Autumn colours, and the richness of the season, we are able to glimpse a little further into the nature of God's love for us as shown in the person of Jesus Christ. Christmas is coming, when we will celebrate the abundance and depth of God's love for us in God's choosing to join us here on earth as a human being. And even if we apparently lose the vibrancy of Autumn and settle into something quieter and more still, Winter reminds us that with God, we always inhabit an abundance of potential.

I recently had a conversation with someone who had been praying for another person to come to faith. The person who was praying had been praying for this for many years. This idea of abundance was in my head when I replied. We cannot ever fully appreciate the scale, the depth, the overwhelming completeness of God's love for us. The abundance of it seeps into every situation. Psalm 139 asks:

Where can I go from your spirit?

Or where can I flee from your presence?

If I ascend to heaven, you are there;

if I make my bed in Sheol, you are there.

If I take the wings of the morning

and settle at the farthest limits of the sea,

even there your hand shall lead me,

and your right hand shall hold me fast.

God is not just with us; God is *abundantly* with us. I realise that not might make grammatical sense, but hopefully you will grasp what I mean. God is not with us wishing to be somewhere else, or with us looking wistfully in the other direction. God is with us and for us and pours out the holy presence upon us. This is why Christmas is so special, because we can see the abundance of God's love for us given in a form that we can readily understand: a beautiful baby who grows to be the kindest, most gracious, most holy, most loving demonstration of love that there ever was or will be. So, we can leave every situation we come across in God's hands, knowing that we, and the people we pray for, are loved beyond our imaginings.

I'm not sure if this is what Keats intended, but when he wrote
Who hath not seen thee oft amid thy store?
Sometimes whoever seeks abroad may find
Thee sitting careless on a granary floor,
Thy hair soft-lifted by the winnowing wind;

it reminds me of all sort of things: Autumn – a time to see God in the amazing store that is the season of Harvest; a desire to seek and see God; and a small child in the shelter found for the holy family 'because there was no place for them in the inn'.

This beautiful blessing is by Avis Palmer:-May Christ come close to you: in the rich riot of autumn colour, in the kicking of crisp and crunchy leaves, in cobwebs festooned with diamond dew, in the first frost's glistening stillness. May you know thrill and wonder and joy.

Amen

And I pray that the abundance of God's love for you will become more and more obvious to you as you journey through the seasons of life.

May God bless you, those whom you love, and those you are called to love in God's name,

Don't be put off if you have never sung with a choir before or a long time ago - it isn't essential to read music as the choir teach the parts line by line and there will be quire members singing beside you giving friendly encouragement and an instrument playing your line. All you need is to readily pick up a tune and sing out joyfully with everyone else. It's a one-off for fun; you won't be committing to any further involvement. The carols are meant for community singing and not too difficult to learn; in some Derbyshire villages they still do it in the pubs, but they originated in church. If you're not sure if your voice is soprano, alto, tenor, or bass you can change round until you find a pitch register you are comfortable with. Everyone will have a booklet of words and nicely laid out music so, if you are a music reader, you will also be completely at home with these unique and joyful carols.

And from 7:00 p.m. to about 9:00 p.m. on the same evening in the church: A concert of seasonal words and music by Immanuel's Ground Quire. Included for people who sign up for the taster day and only £10 if you are just coming to the concert.

Evening ticket proceeds for the church - towards our community hall improvements. Come and bring your friends to the concert, support our fund raising and welcome the coming Christmas season. 
Organised by the Friends of Homewood. The Friends of Homewood raise money to pay for activities and outings for the residents.
